Our teaching philosophy prioritizes **project-based learning**. We engage students with real-life problem solving through **team-taught interdisciplinary** courses. VIS equips students with the knowledge, skills, and practices to address and solve the challenges of a globalized society. Over their time at VIS, students learn to identify, analyze, and take concrete actions to improve themselves, their communities, and the world.

ACADEMIC PROGRAMS

We align our core curriculum and Interdisciplinary Project-Based Learning (IPBL) curriculum with the standards of the Ontario Secondary curriculum. Students who graduate from VIS receive the Senior High School Diploma in Experimental Education from the Taipei City Government, Department of Education.

GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS

Grade 9-12 students have a general requirement to complete **54 credits**. Credits are awarded by semester (ie, a year-long course is 2 credits). These credits include required courses, selections from mandatory academic areas, and open-choice electives.

INTERDISCIPLINARY PROJECT BASED LEARNING PROGRAM

VIS students in the core program engage in Interdisciplinary Project Based Learning in the classroom for 10 hours each week. Each year, teachers –who are experts in their fields–collaborate to design unique projects revolving around themes centered on social change and the **UN Sustainable Development Goals**. They guide students to respond to authentic and complex challenges to serve local and global communities. Students collaborate with **community partners**, including local NGOs, schools, and businesses to create real-world impact. Students present their work to the community in a **final student exhibition** to showcase their learning journey.

In grade 12, students propose, develop, and complete a **Capstone Project**. The Capstone Project requires deep inquiry into a local manifestation of a global challenge of the student’s choice. To complete their Capstone Project, the student designs, builds, and implements a locally-focused solution.

The **PBL+ program**, which is designed for students seeking an additional challenge, allows students to propose independent projects. Students take on additional ownership over their learning by finding a VIS teacher as a project mentor, adding a curricular strand, and connecting their current project with their educational journey. Students are also required to seek outside specialists/community partners to gain a practical understanding of their subject and gain real-world experience.

Special Note: Due to the larger weight in the timetable, PBL courses are 2.5 credits per semester



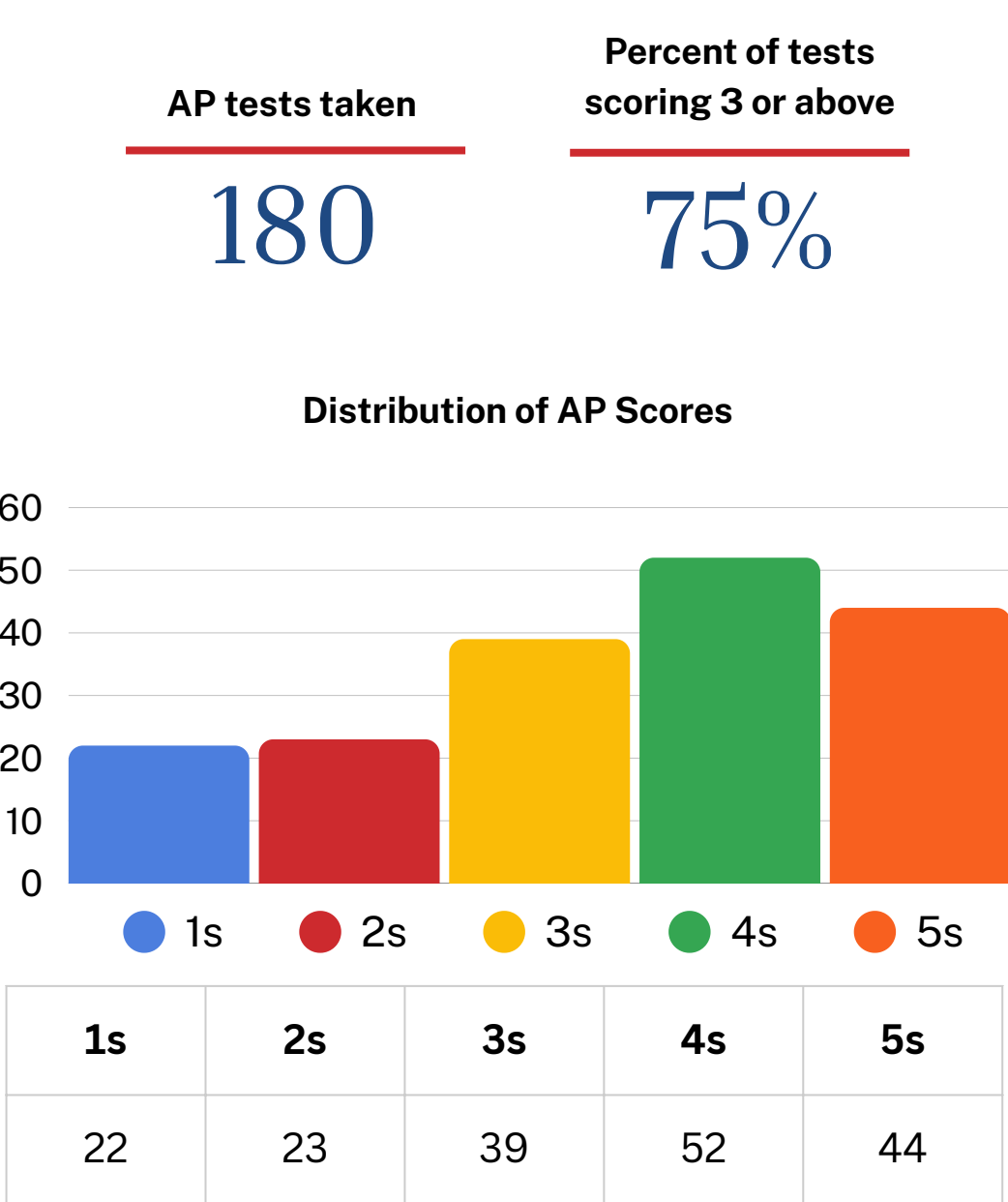
ADDITIONAL PROGRAMS

Cooperative Education

The Cooperative Education program at VIS offers G11 and G12 students a flexible option for hands-on learning through **internships, laboratory work, and off-campus project-based learning**. Students engage in supervised work or research placements with university, NGO, government, or industry partners. The program emphasizes personalized learning goals, reflective practice, and communication. Each semester, 5-8 students successfully apply for Cooperative Education.

Advanced Placement

VIS offers optional afterschool **Advanced Placement** for students who intend to study in the United States, or who want further studies in a particular content area. VIS also gives students the flexibility to independently study AP courses through UC Scout and other accredited programs.

Honors Program

The Honors Program Problem-Based Learning challenges students through **individual research supervised by professors**. Students give weekly presentations of their work in progress, with deliverables including **research papers**. This year, ten G12 students are in the Honors Program. International Partnerships

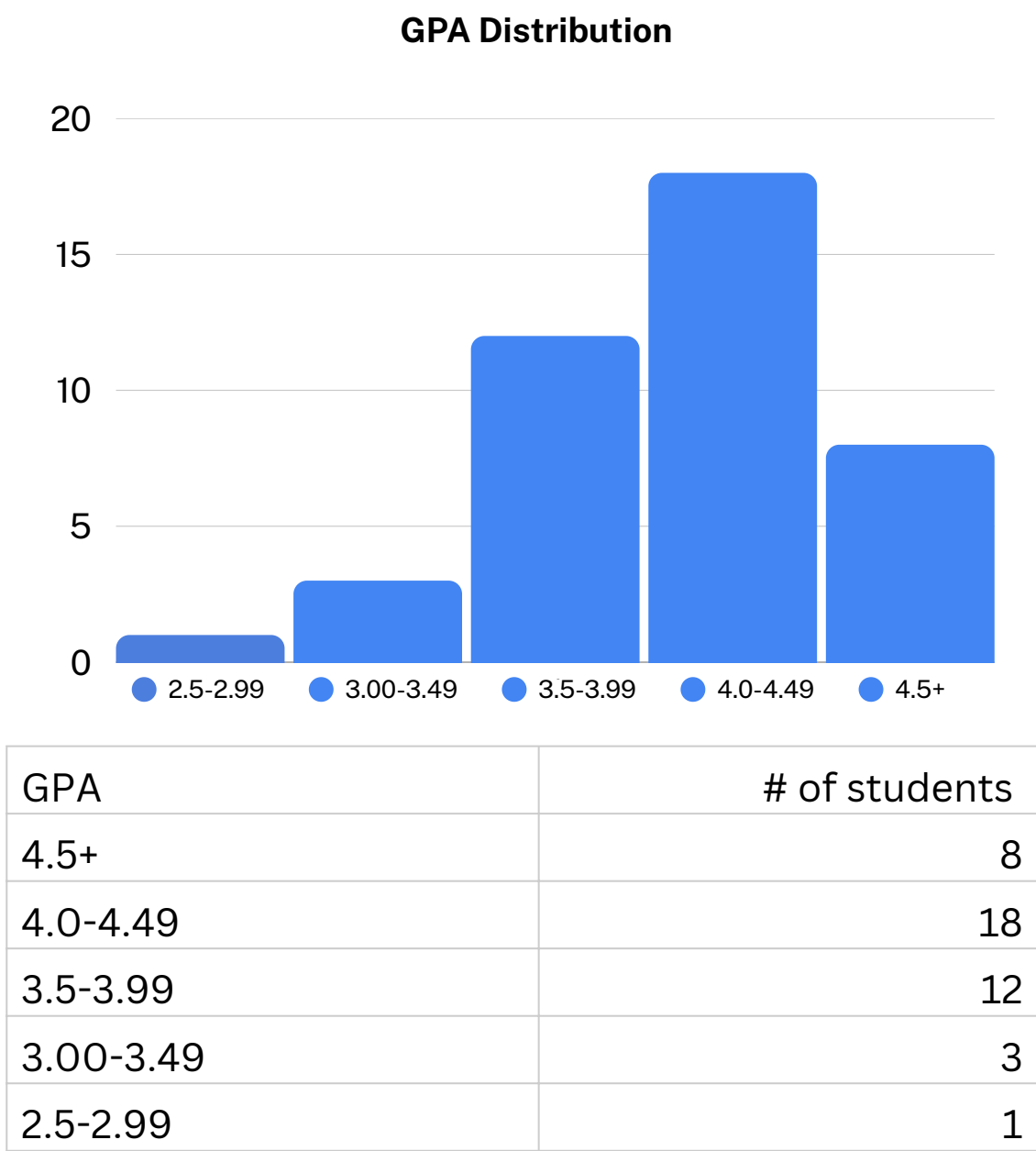
